

In the month of December, the children at Little Learners Nursery and Preschool will be developing their knowledge and understanding about different topics. Our topics are Seasons and Chinese New Year, the children will be learning about the different season's we experience every year. The children will also be learning about the Chinese new year and why it is celebrated. These topics will be relatable to the seven areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage. The EYFS sets the standards for the learning, development and care of children from birth to five vears old.

<u>Seasons</u>

To start the new year of 2023, the children will be learning about the four seasons and the types of different weather we experience in each season, such as: sun, rain, wind and snow. The children will get to enjoy lots of fantastic learning activities,

whilst building up their knowledge on the seasons. Taking local walks to the park the children will be able to explore the environment around them. The children will also have a chance to make lots of different crafts around the topic seasons such as: rain shakers, creating our own 4 season tree using different materials. To Challenge the older children's imagination and develop their fine motor skills, they will be creating their own bear hunt maps, to then use and put into their play, this activity links in with one of our core books 'We're going on a bear hunt'.

Tasty treats will be made by all, incorporating our learning topic of



'weather' such as sunshine smoothies, snowball peppermint creams and Rainbow biscuits. Yummy!

Chinese New Year

Chinese new year is a festival of celebrations for the welcoming of the traditional Chinese New Year calendar. The festival is usually referred to as the Spring Festival in modern China. The initial start of Chinese New Year begins at the first day of the new moon and 2023 celebrates the year of the Rabbit!

This topic of learning will help the children to recognize and celebrate cultural differences through play and allow them an opportunity to taste different types of Chinese food. To continue developing the children's fine motor skills, they will be creating lots of colorful pictures of

fireworks, making Chinese lanterns and collages of the Chinese dragon.

cold, crisp nights of winter, kids will learn all about the four seasons,




as well as how clouds form, why it rains, what causes a rainbow and storms, and so much more.
